

Thursday · January 24th









Friday · February 1st



Starting off in Hobart, you head towards the town of Dunalley. A quiet little town known for its fresh seafood and waterfront scenery.

Head towards Eaglehawk Neck - home to the quaint little village of "Doo", where almost every house has the word 'Doo' in its name. You also take a look at the natural formations of the Tasman Arch and Blowhole.

Your next stop is the main attraction being the Port Arthur Historic Site. Sitting tranquilly amidst English oaks and gardens, Port Arthur is a harsh contrast to the beauty of the Tasman Peninsula. Rich in visual history, the Port Arthur Historic Site evokes a powerful sense of Australia's convict history and of early Australian settlement heritage.

Spend time exploring the multitude of restored and ruined buildings and learn of the site's dramatic history. Enjoy a short harbour cruise or a walking tour of the Isle of the Dead and get a feel for what it is like to arrive by boat at this desolate location and gain a more powerful insight into the personal life and struggles of the convicts.

On your way back to Hobart, stop at the Port Arthur Lavender Farm, where you can sample all things lavender (even ice cream), then your final stop is the Tasmanian UnZoo. Known to most as a Tasmanian Devil Conservation Park, you can get up close with one the Tasmanian Devils as well as the other native Tasmanian animals.

Saturday · February 2nd



Today explore the Salamanca Market, which is one of Australia's most loved outdoor markets and can be found every Saturday morning, along the historic Salamanca Place, next to the Hobart waterfront. It's a destination that's hard to beat and is absolutely free to enjoy.

The market has an electric mix of over 300 stallholders showcasing delicious food, artisan jewellery, fine Tasmanian handcrafted timbers, handmade clothing, as well as vintage collectables, pottery, plants and flowers.



Travel via fast ferry from Hobart to the world renown MONA (Museum of Old & New Art) where you can experience the extraordinary architecture of this world famous gallery and explore MONA's permanent collection as well as an array of visiting exhibitions.

Sunday · February 3rd



Enjoy rock lobster and oysters shucked straight from the water. Watch your guide dive for abalone and sea urchin and be delighted as your catch is turned into a delicious seafood feast accompanied by gourmet local produce and Tasmanian wines, boutique beers and juices.

This full-day cruise begins on Hobart's vibrant waterfront, amongst the fishing boats moored at Constitution Dock. You will cruise aboard a custom-built vessel, featuring a spacious enclosed cabin and luxury leather seats. You'll be one of up to only 12 guests treated to an unforgettable day of indulgence and relaxation.

Cruise down the Derwent River and into the sheltered waters of the D'Entrecasteaux Channel which surrounds Bruny Island. As you voyage south, you leave all traces of civilization behind.







Sunday · February 10th



Feed the fish at Ned's Beach

As well as being one of Lord Howe's most picture postcard perfect beaches and a great spot for snorkelling. In 2005 Ned's was voted Australia's cleanest beach. Ned's is also where the Island's fish will come to you.

Be part of a tradition that has enchanted visitors and locals for generations any time of day make your way to Neds and feed the mullet, wrasse, garfish, silver-drummer, spangled-emperor and of course the royalty of Lord Howe fish, metre-long kingfish.

Climb Malabar Hill or take the ridge walk to Kim's Lookout

One of Lord Howe's most popular walks starts on Ned's Beach Road and offers spectacular views along the spine of the Island's mountain ridge as well as magnificent views over The Lagoon. This 3-hour return walk (class 4-5) takes you through Kentia palm groves and shearwater breeding burrows.

At Malabar Hill (209 metres) the cliffs plunge dramatically into the ocean below and the crannies in the cliff shelter one of the world's largest colonies of red-tailed tropic-birds.

Between September and May the birds put on a mesmerising ariel display. If you continue to Kim's Lookout (a more challenging climb that extends your trek to a 5-hour return) you'll be rewarded with superb views of Mt Gower and the Island's jewel-coloured reef.

BBQ Islander style

Islander's know how to enjoy themselves and you too can embrace the relaxed Lord Howe way of life with a BBQ at Ned's Beach or Cobby's Corner. North Bay is another of the Island's magical BBQ areas.

Board a wave at Blinky Beach

One of Lord Howe's eastern-facing beaches, Blinky's has some of the best breaks on the island and has Australia's least crowded waves wax up and go narley, body surf or simply swim and enjoy.

Explore the Marine Park

Snorkel, scuba dive, kayak or join a glass-bottom boat tour of the lagoon. The crystal-clear waters of Lord Howe are home to more than 500 species of fish and 90 species of coral. The pristine fringing reef - the southernmost in the world - is celebrated for its diversity and exceptional natural beauty. All the waters surrounding Lord Howe Island were declared a Marine Park in 1999.

Go Gower

It's not for the faint-hearted, but the one-day hike to Mt Gower (875m) is considered one of the world's best climbs. The guided, 8-hour return, class 5 walk, has a section that is rope-assisted and also includes some narrow ridge walks with nerve-testing sheer drops. However, the 14km walk provides some of the Island's most rewarding experiences including encounters with rare flora and Lord Howe's famous woodhen.

Little Island

A walk to the southern end of Lord Howe takes you to Little Island, home of the woodhen. If you're lucky enough to be here in winter, you'll be able to call down the magnificent providence petrels. Join naturalist Ian Hutton for walking or boat tours.

Goat House

Tackle the challenging climb to the Goat House cave on Mt Lidgbird and as your reward witness spectacular views over the island. Enjoy a picnic lunch in this ancient setting before descending through the rainforest below.

Expedition to Balls Pyramid

Twenty-three kilometres to the south of Lord Howe Island is a spectacular 550-metre spearhead of grey basalt that seemingly explodes from the ocean. The world's largest sea stack is home to extraordinary birdlife and the waters surrounding Balls Pyramid are teeming with marine life. A cruise to Balls Pyramid is astonishing. For experienced divers, Balls is an unparalleled adventure.
